



GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACT SUBMISSION ISAD 2018

Abstracts for oral or poster presentations will represent a vital component of the scientific program at the ISAD 2018. Abstracts can be submitted as focused studies, investigations, or observations in Atopic Dermatitis.

Important dates:

- **Submission deadline: January 15, 2018**
- Abstract notifications mailed: February 15, 2018
- Deadline registration presenting authors: March 1, 2018

Rules for abstract submission

- Authors are required to indicate their preference for either oral or poster presentation. The ISAD 2018 Scientific Committee will make the final decision on the format of presentation.
- Acceptance or rejections of abstracts will be based on rankings given by a peer review of experts in the associated topic/category session. Results of the selection process will be sent via e-mail to the corresponding author. The Committee decision is final and cannot be appealed.
- Abstracts cannot be identical to any abstract that has previously been presented at a major international meeting. An update to prior work is acceptable.
- Instructions on the preparation of posters and information regarding projection facilities will be included with the notification of acceptance.
- Submission of an abstract indicates:
 - That the author(s) agree to comply with the abstract submission and presentation rules;
 - That the presentation is based on scientific and/or clinical methods that are ethical and valid;
 - That the author(s) have contributed to and approve the abstract and its entire contents.
- The presenting author agrees to register, attend, and present the abstract at the ISAD 2018. The presenting author **MUST REGISTER AND PAY THE APPLICABLE FEE BY MARCH 1, 2018.**
- Registrations not received / paid by the deadline, will result in a rejection of the submitted abstract (i.e. no possibility to either present a poster or oral presentation). Confirmations of acceptance are sent to those who persons who submitted the abstract (contact author), if you did not receive an e-mail with a confirmation, please contact the secretariat by e-mail: info@congresscare.com. NOTE: If you did not receive a (automatic generated) confirmation of receipt from the secretarial office, your abstract has not been received. Please send an e-mail in order to resolve this.
- Mailed, e-mailed or faxed abstracts will not be accepted. NOTE: If you have any problems with submitting your abstract on our website, please contact the administration office for assistance at: info@congresscare.com
- Presenters are solely responsible for submission and subsequent confirmation of our receipt of their abstracts.
- All designated presenting poster authors must be present during the Poster Session.
- No travel compensation is provided for abstract presenters (neither oral nor poster).

Guidelines & abstract lay-out:

All abstracts must be submitted via the online abstract submission module. Please limit your abstracts to 400 words or less. Abstracts (oral and poster) will be published in the congress abstract book and/or on the ISAD website. All abstracts will be published as submitted.



- Abstracts must be written and presented in English.
- Title: Use a concise descriptive title that indicates the content of the abstract. The complete title should be CAPITALIZED. Please minimize the use of abbreviations in the title. Commercial trade names for drugs, devices, products and services may NOT be used in the title.
- Authors: Names and surnames for each author must be provided.
- Affiliations: Each author should be listed by department, institution, city, and country.
- Keyword(s): A minimum of one (1), and a maximum of three (3) keywords reflecting the contents of the abstract should be provided.
- Abstracts should not exceed 400 words. Abstract that are not written in understandable English will be rejected and/or returned to the author(s) for revision. The body of the abstract text must be formatted with the sub-headings as in the submission page.

Abstract must be composed, following and making use of the design below:

- Background
- Objective
- Methods
- Results
- Conclusions

Drugs, devices, products, and services should be identified by generic name only within the abstract. Data must be given in units (International metric system is preferred). NO REFERENCES, TABLES, CHARTS OR IMAGES ARE ALLOWED.

Abstracts will be classified into thematic areas. Please indicate the appropriate topic classification to which your abstract belongs.

- Co-morbidities
- Gaps in evidence
- Mechanisms of disease: from phenotypes to endotypes
- Mechanisms of disease: genetics & -omics
- New targets, systemic treatments and new treatments
- Outcome measures
- Patients' perspectives/ education/eHealth
- Miscellaneous
